The Copper Project series

I worked on the following pieces as three-dimensional objects. But instead of thinking about how solid and space interact as a sculptor would, my intention is to go back to the "flat two dimensional picture plane." Why?

Because of this, formulations are produced that require the addition of a curve in order to be considered plausible. Finally, when it is viewed on a two-dimensional flattened image plane (the switch from three- to two-dimensionality), a unique aesthetic emerges that appears to be more in keeping with how humans perceive the 'natural' world: although we can only perceive in two dimensions, we are aware of and experience a world beyond our own.



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Quantum Legs:

55h x 105w x 2d cm

Oxidised copper sheet (.55mm thick), mounted to a 3mm aluminium composite panel with 9mm spacing. MDF panel (6mm) with 10mm spacing. Sealed with a micro-crystalline wax

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From The Ashes:

60h x 110w x 3d cm

Oxidised copper sheet (.55mm thick), mounted to a 3mm aluminium composite panel with 9mm spacing. Additional copper relief sheet is mounted with 7mm spacing. Sealed with a micro-crystalline wax

58h x 108w x 3d cm Oxidised copper sheet (.55mm thick), mounted to a 3mm aluminium composite panel with 10mm spacing. Sealed with oil paint and micro-crystalline wax

Artist Statement

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Since 2004, I have been developing the idea that a different kind of aesthetic is created when events are deployed on a curved canvas (rather than a flat 'two dimensional' plane). The marks created in this way take on the form of the geometric profile. So when they are unraveled and stretched-out to the two dimensional picture plane, the aesthetic emerges.

I call this approach Membrane Art[®]. As it is the curved profile of the surfaces that underpins the development of each artwork. An aesthetic thought that I continue to evolve.
